# University of Southern Denmark Denmark

- Location:** With 6 campus locations, Odense is the largest and where most JCU exchange students go. Odense is Denmark's third largest city and is centrally located on the island of Funen between Jutland and Zealand. In Odense you can see Hans Christian Andersen's house and discover Andersen's amazing fairy tale universe. Odense, which is one of Denmark's oldest cities dating back more than 1,000 years, is laid out on a manageable scale with green areas and a stream that winds through the city.
- Campuses:** University of Southern Denmark has more than 27,000 students and the university offers teaching and research at 6 campuses situated on Funen, in the south of Jutland and west of Zealand – in Odense, Kolding, Esbjerg, Copenhagen, Sønderborg and Slagelse. - Visa requirements:** If you are a non-EU citizen you must apply for a residence permit through the Danish Embassy in your home country before leaving. The form to apply for the residence permit (ST1) is included in your admission pack. Ensure you apply as soon as you receive your offer, as it takes 2-3 months to get the residence permit.
